## Thanksgiving Worship

**HYMN:** 613 “Come, You Thankful People, Come”

**INVOCATION:**

M: In the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

**C: Amen.**

**THANKSGIVING SENTENCES:**

*Responses are from Martin Luther’s explanation of the 4th petition of the Lord’s Prayer, as well as part of the Common Table Prayer (Ps. 107:1).*

M: Give us this day our daily bread.

**C: God surely gives daily bread without our asking, even to all the wicked.**

M: Give us this day our daily bread.

**C: We pray in this petition that he would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.**

M: Give us this day our daily bread.

**C: O, give thanks to the Lord for he is good, and his loving kindness endures forever. Amen.**

**CONFESSION OF SINS:**

*Based on Psalms 130 & 38.*

M: Even on days of thanksgiving, even especially on a day of thanksgiving, we realize how unworthy we are of all of God’s gifts, blessings and grace. We come to him in the words of the psalms to confess our sins.

**C: Out of the depths I cry to you, Lord; Lord, hear my voice. Let your ears be attentive to my cry for mercy. If you, Lord, kept a record of sins, Lord, who could stand? But with you there is forgiveness, so that we can, with reverence, serve you. Lord, do not rebuke me in your anger or discipline me in your wrath. My guilt has overwhelmed me, like a burden too heavy to bear. I confess my iniquity; I am troubled by my sin. Lord, do not forsake me; do not be far from me, my God. Come quickly to help me, my Lord and my Savior.**

**ABSOLUTION:***Based on Psalm 103.*

M: Praise the Lord, my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name. Praise the Lord, my soul, and forget not all his benefits—who forgives all your sins and heals all your diseases, who redeems your life from the pit and crowns you with love and compassion, who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's. The Lord works righteousness and justice for all the oppressed. He made known his ways to Moses, his deeds to the people of Israel: The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love. He will not always accuse, nor will he harbor his anger forever; he does not treat us as our sins deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us.

**C: Amen.****THANKSGIVING PRAYER OF THE DAY:**

M: Let us pray.

Almighty God our Father, your generous goodness comes to us new every day. By the work of your Spirit lead us to acknowledge your goodness, give thanks for your benefits, and serve you in willing obedience; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

<sup>18</sup>Noah went out with his sons, his wife, and his sons' wives along with him. <sup>19</sup>Every animal, every creeping thing, every bird, and whatever swarms on the earth went out of the ship, species by species.

<sup>20</sup>Noah built an altar to the LORD and took from every clean animal and every clean bird and offered burnt offerings on the altar. <sup>21</sup>The LORD smelled the pleasant aroma. The LORD said in his heart, "I will never again curse the soil anymore because of man, for the thoughts he forms in his heart are evil from his youth. Neither will I ever again strike every living thing, as I have done. <sup>22</sup>While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, and day and night shall not cease."

**C: We praise and thank you for the gift of speech and writing, by which we share our thoughts and needs with you and with one another. We thank you for the gift of music which brings joy and comfort to our lives.**

*Hymn 610, v3*

**All praise and thanks to God the Father now be given,  
The Son, and him who reigns with them in highest heaven,  
The one eternal God, whom earth and heaven adore!  
For thus it was, is now, and shall be evermore.**

M: We glorify and thank you, O God, for all the blessings you ever have, are now, and ever will give to us undeserving sinners. We do this in Jesus' name, in whom we also pray and say,

**THE LORD'S PRAYER:**

**Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.**
